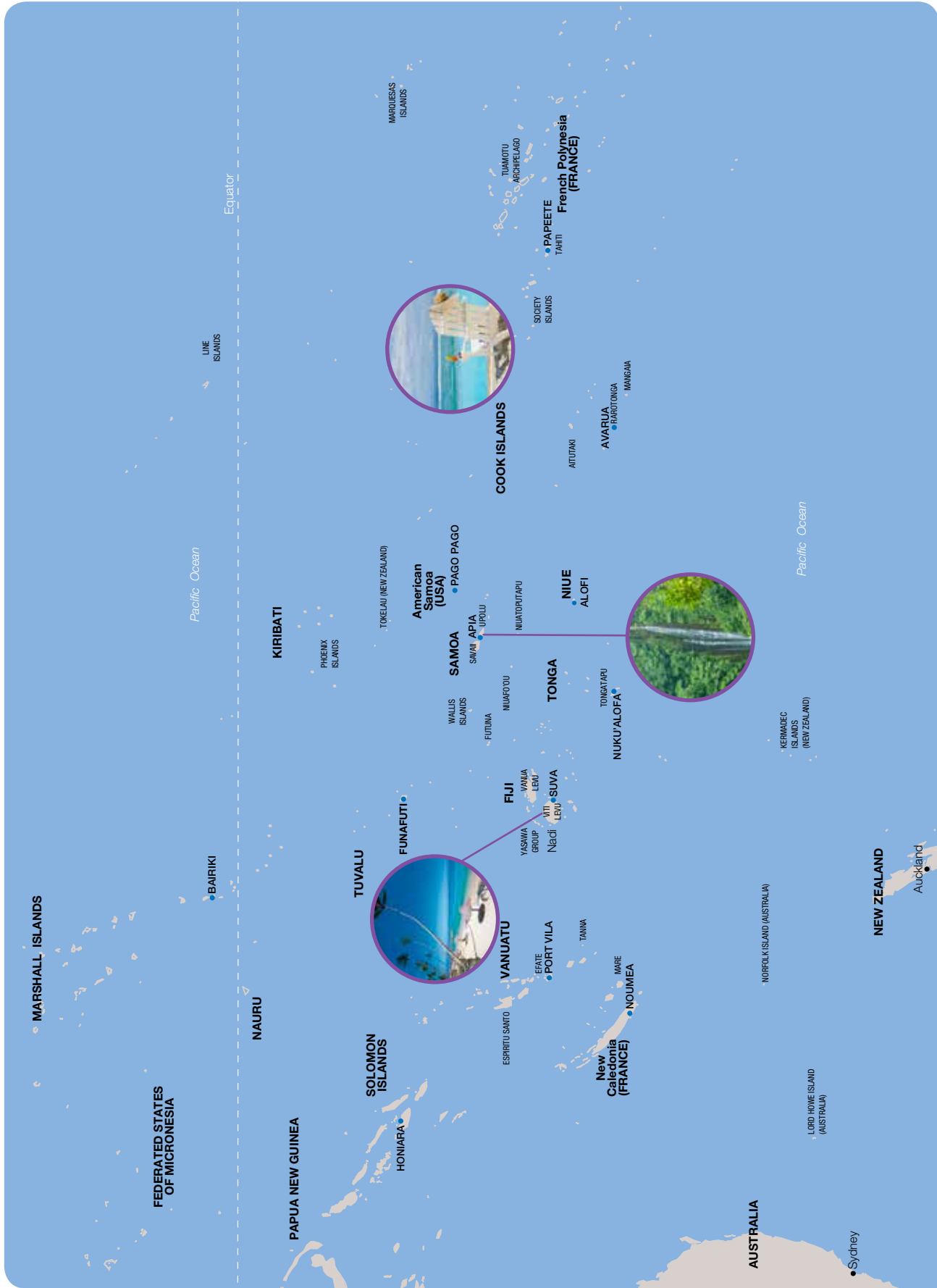

### Tu's Place Nadi

Though they offer Western-style breakfasts and some tasty Thai meals, the focus here is on Fijian cuisine, especially seafood. This is a great place to try Kokoda, a raw fish dish marinated in lemon juice and served in coconut milk.



### Mamanuca Islands

If you like to spend days in the water then look no further than the Mamanucas. A great spot for water sports; discover famous dive sites, snorkelling or check out one of the best surf breaks in the world.

### Fiji's Adventure Capital

Pacific Harbour is for those who like to get their adrenalin pumping. Diving with sharks, zip-line through the rainforest, or white water raft through rapids.



### Taveuni

Immerse yourself in nature in Taveuni. Bouma National Heritage Park makes up more than a third of the island, and is also home to the marine park at Waitabu – with world-renowned dive sites such as Eel Reef and the Great White Wall.



### Culture in Nadi

Visit the beautiful Hindu temple Sri Siva Subramaniya Swami. Strikingly bright, this is one of the few temples outside India where you can see traditional Dravidian architecture.



### The Sun Coast

Known for its spectacular shoreline, explore the Ra peninsula by kayak or stand up paddle-boards. Venture out to sea with world class game fishing, windsurfing or diving on the reefs.

## WHEN TO GO

Sitting firmly in the tropics, you can generally expect warm weather all year round. The wet season is from November through to April, and if you don't mind the odd afternoon thunderstorm, this is also the best-value time to travel. Most resorts in Fiji cater to families, so school holidays are the busiest time to travel.

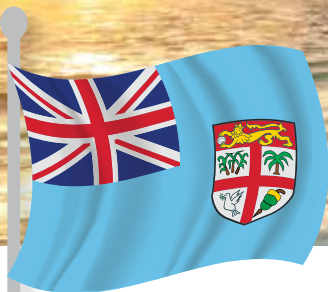

## CURRENCY

The official currency of Fiji is the Fijian dollar (FJD). Major credit cards are accepted in resorts and tourist areas. Tipping is not encouraged anywhere in Fiji, a smile and a thank you is generally enough.

## LANGUAGE

Fiji's official language is English; however, several ethnic Fijian dialects are widely used in community groups. *Bula* is a Fijian greeting used when meeting friends. It can mean good life, health and happiness, or simply hello. *Vinaka* means thank you, and after a few days in Fiji you'll definitely want to say, *au maru* (I'm happy).

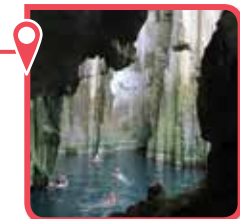


## Experience Culture

## Majestic Manta Rays

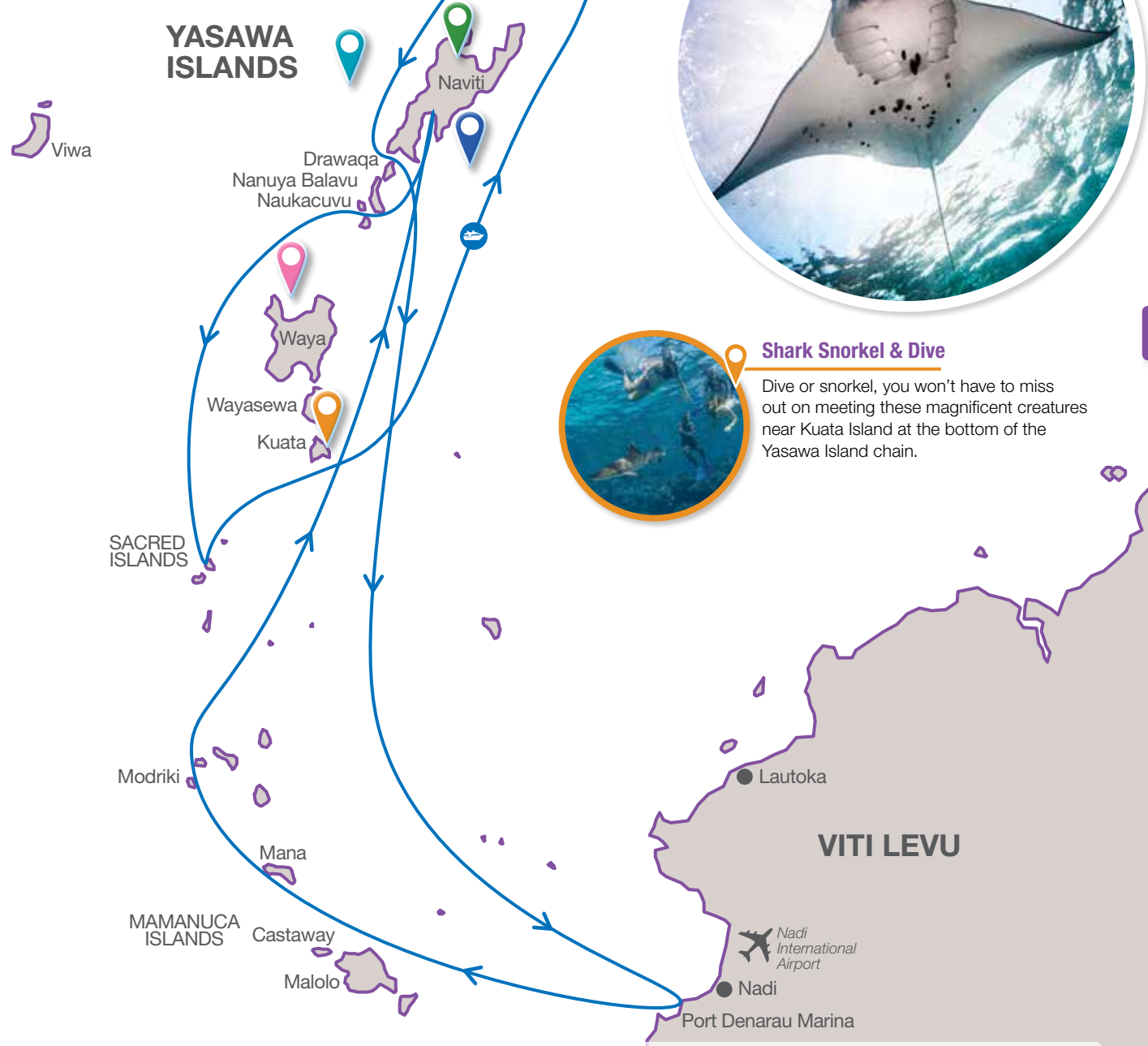

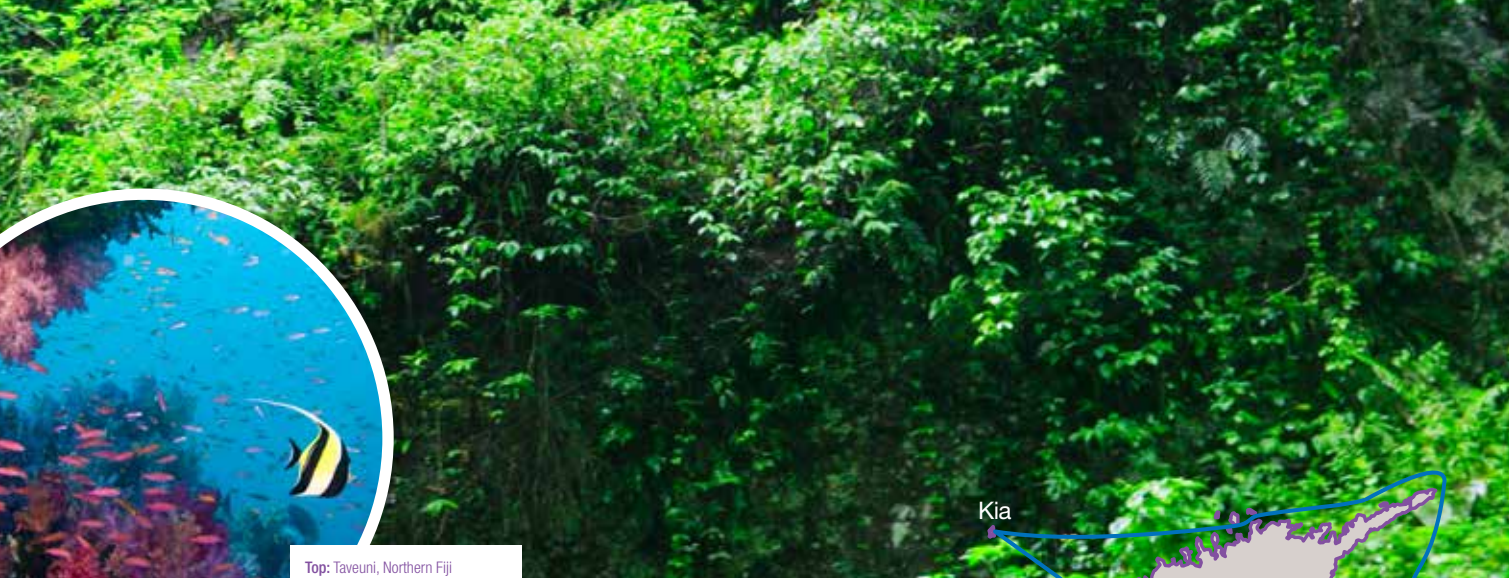
## International Date Line

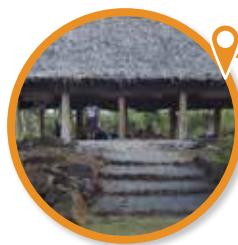
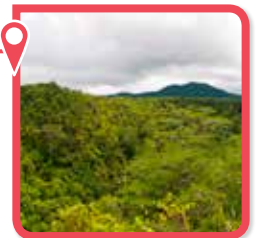
## Robert Louis Stevenson's Museum

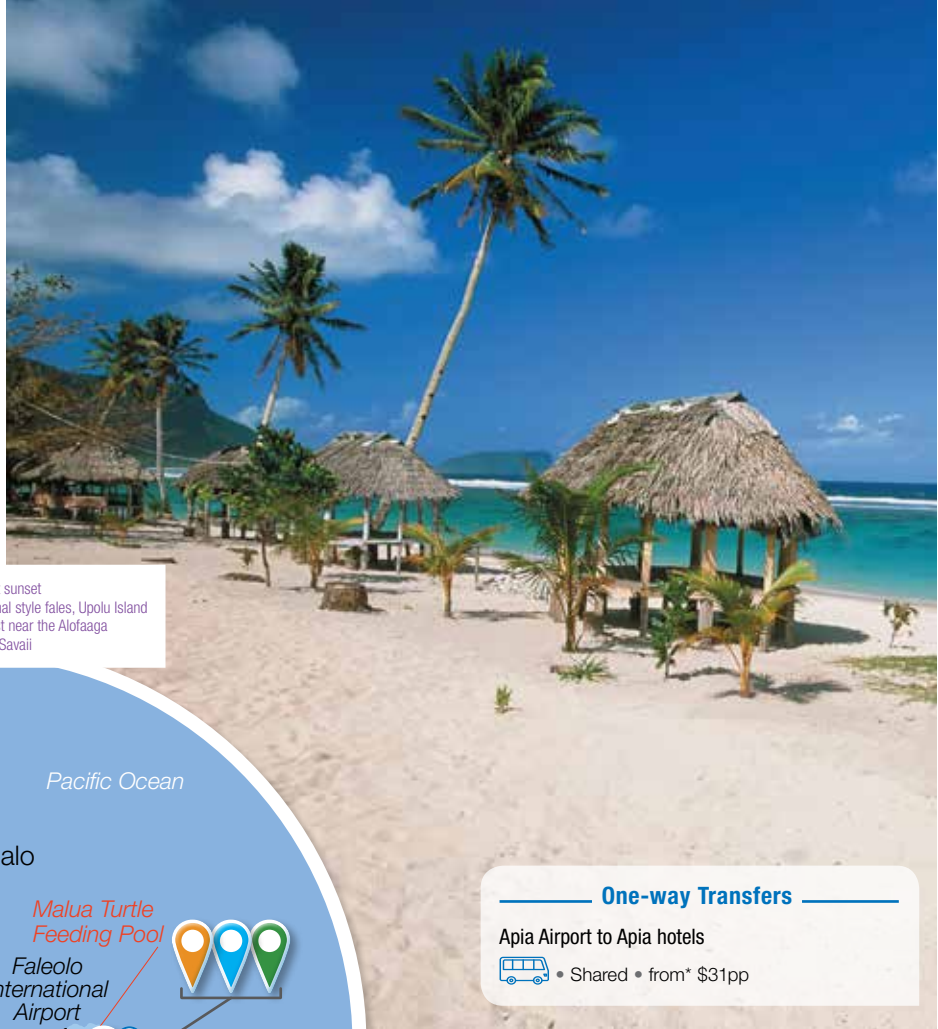

The Oro, Kuto and Kanumera Bays offer spectacular beauty and a must visit when exploring this Island. Also, being home to ruins of the penal colony, it's great for history buffs wanting to delve more into this rich history.

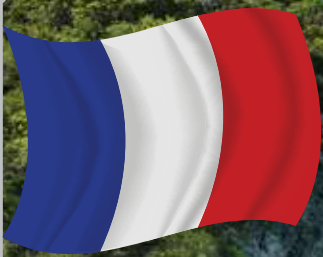

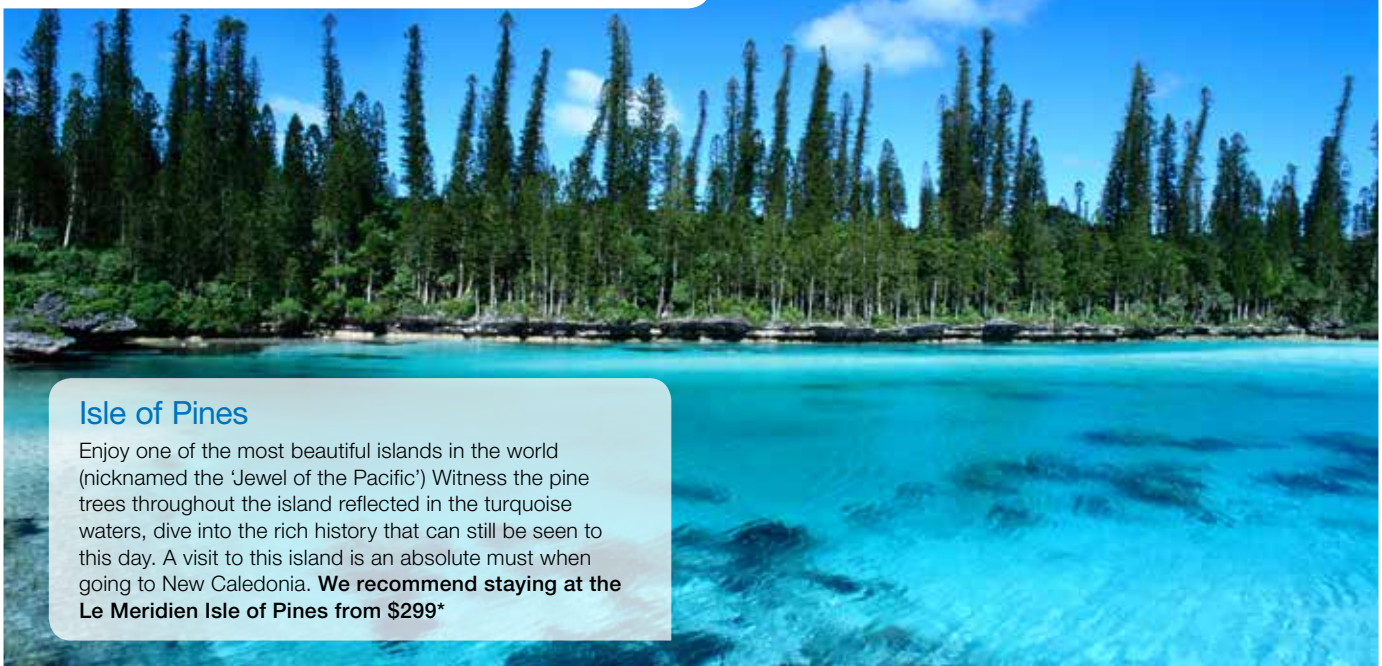
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### Grand Terre
