

SOUTHWEST BC SEAPLANE SAFARI | 9 DAYS

GRIZZLY BEARS OF KNIGHT INLET LODGE | 4 DAYS

Knight Inlet is a 100km long fjord carved by glaciers in the coastal mountains. This pristine wilderness is the native habitat of the grizzly bear, which you will seek out on wildlife viewing expeditions from Knight Inlet Lodge, a floating lodge tucked away in Glendale Cove. 

FRASER RIVER FISHING LODGE | 3 DAYS

Tucked away on the shore of British Columbia's mighty Fraser River sits a freshwater fishing lodge perfect for couples and families looking to get away from it all. Fraser River Fishing Lodge is situated on 16 private acres where a herd of wild bison roam along the river bank, and every room comes with breathtaking mountain and river views.

DAY 2 FRASER RIVER FISHING LODGE

Today you'll embark on a guided salmon or sturgeon fishing trip along the beautiful Fraser River. The boats take off directly from the lodge and continue up the Fraser Canyon, offering stunning mountain and rock wall views from the water. Salmon are fished from late July to November, with sturgeon fishing running all year. White sturgeons are protected in the Fraser River and as a result are plentiful; all are carefully released after taking a picture.

DAY 3 FRASER RIVER > VANCOUVER

Enjoy some time at leisure before returning to Vancouver.

Fly from Ottawa to Iqaluit by jet (approximately 3½ hours). Change to turboprop or other plane and fly Iqaluit to Pond Inlet. A private aerial flight to camp provides stunning aerial views of the vast Arctic landscapes, including dramatic mountains and icebergs in and around Sirmilik National Park.

DAYS 2 - 5 NAVY BOARD INLET

Head out each day in small groups to the floe edge, travelling by snowmobile and qamutik (traditional Inuit sled). One of the greatest highlights for many guests on this safari is the opportunity to observe a variety of Arctic wildlife in their natural habitat, including narwhal, beluga, bowhead whales, seals, and polar bears. Delve into the Inuit culture on a journey to traditional Inuit hunting grounds, by qamutik and snowmobile.

DAYS 6 NAVY BOARD INLET > POND INLET

Enjoy your final day in the High Arctic wilderness before flying directly out of camp to Pond Inlet. Explore the town at your leisure and spend your final night in a hotel. This evening we will enjoy an Inuit cultural presentation.

DAY 7 POND INLET > OTTAWA

Transfer to the Pond Inlet airport. Board your flight back to Ottawa via Iqaluit and onwards to home.




