the evening, embark on a night safari to see if you can spot wild animals such as civet, barking deer, porcupines, or elephants. Overnight at Phuwanalee Resort (or similar). (B)

### Day 4 Khao Yai – Ayutthaya

Drive to Khao Yai National Park, stopping at Heow Suwat waterfalls, made famous when they were used as a site location for filming the movie *The Beach*. Continue to Ayutthaya Historical Park, Wat Phra Mahathat, believed to house relics of the Lord Buddha. Visit Wat Phra Si Sanphet, from which the Temple of the Emerald Buddha in Bangkok has been copied. Overnight at Kantary Hotel Ayutthaya (or similar). (B)

### Day 5 Ayutthaya – Kanchanaburi

Ayutthaya was once one of Indochina's most prosperous cities, with numerous magnificent structures and ruins. Visit Bang Pa-In Summer Palace, used by the royal court as a summer retreat in the 17th century. The only royal residence open to the public is Wehart Chamrunt Palace, constructed entirely of materials imported from China. Visit JEATH War Museum, a realistic depiction of prisoner-of-war living quarters, with photographic, pictorial and physical memorabilia dating from World War II. Continue to Kanchanaburi War Cemetery, final resting place of 6,982 war prisoners (mostly British, Dutch, Australian and American) who lost their lives during the construction of the Bridge over the River Kwai and the railway to Burma (the Death Railway). Stay the next two nights at the Mida Kanchanaburi (or similar). (B)

### Day 6 Kanchanaburi

Today, we will visit Hellfire Pass (Konyu Cutting) and Hellfire Pass Museum, built and maintained by the Australian government, and dedicated to the Allied prisoners of war and Asian labourers who suffered and died at Hellfire Pass and elsewhere in the Asia Pacific region during World War II. Also visit world-famous Bridge over the River Kwai, a part of the Death Railway constructed by Allied prisoners of war. Take leisurely walks around town and pictures on the world-renowned Death Railway. (BD)

### Day 7 River Kwai – Hua Hin

Today, head to Hua Hin in the Cha Am district. After you arrive, the rest of the day is free at your leisure. Stay the next three nights at Grand Pacific Sovereign Resort & Spa (or similar). (B)

### Day 8 Hua Hin

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel, followed by a free day at leisure. (B)

### Day 9 Hua Hin

Discover the beaches and small town of Hua Hin, with another free day at leisure. (B)

After analysis, the then-king commissioned a pavilion to be built to shelter the precious artefact. Visitors can also see an inscription by King Rama V, engraved during his visit to pay respect to the Lord Buddha's footprint. After that visit Wat Theppitak Punnaram Temple with its 45-metre-high, white Buddha statue given by His Majesty King Rama IX. The meaning of the measurement is that the Buddha had been meditating for 45 years before his enlightenment. In

### DAY 1 Colombo

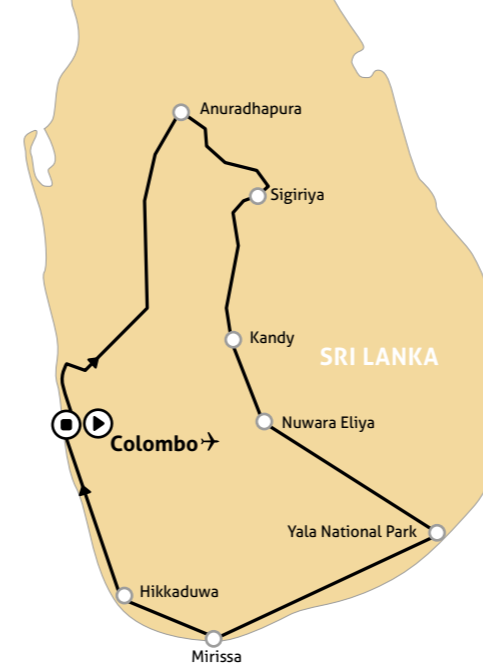

All other travel documentation, such as hotel, car hire, transfer and tour vouchers will be emailed to you as an e-document. Should the Third-Party Travel Provider issue paper vouchers, these will be posted to you.

### SPECIAL NEEDS

Travellers with a physical or mental disability that may require special assistance during their trip must advise us of their needs upon booking and declare all pre-existing medical conditions. This enables us to ensure the suitability of each booking to the individual traveller.

### BEDDING CONFIGURATION

Requests for specific bedding types must be made at the time of booking, however, cannot be guaranteed. Note that double rooms can be fitted with either double or twin beds. Also note that single rooms are often smaller than other rooms. Triple rooms usually comprise a twin bed room with an additional sofa bed, roll-away bed or a foldaway bed for a third person.

### TRAVELLING WITH CHILDREN

### TRIP GRADING

Each of our tours has been given a grading to help you choose the trip that best suits your needs. - Easy – Suitable for travellers with an average level of fitness. You may be required to take part in easy walking tours and board boats.
