When to Go

Argentina: The weather in Buenos Aires is pleasant year round, while the best time to visit Patagonia is December to March when the weather is at its best. Lower humidity during April to November makes this the most comfortable time to visit Iguazú while Mendoza is optimal during September to December. Given its southern location, the summer months between December and March are the best time to visit Ushuaia.

Chile: Santiago can be visited year round while the southern region, including the Lakes District and Torres del Paine, is best visited from October to April when many resorts and attractions are open. December to March is the best time to visit Atacama.

Peru: The dry season is from May to September and is best for visiting the entire country. November to March is wet season and is a good time to visit the coastal towns.

Visas & Passports

A valid passport is required with at least six months validity beyond the intended stay. A visa for Argentina is not required for stays up to 90 days. A visa for Chile is not required for stays up to 90 days. A visa for Peru is not required for stays up to 90 days. A visa for Brazil is not required for stays up to 90 days. A visa for Bolivia is not required for stays up to 90 days. A visa for Uruguay is not required for stays up to 90 days. Travel advice is available from the New Zealand Government Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade at www.safetravel.govt.nz.

Time

Argentina is 15 hours behind New Zealand Standard Time (NZST). Chile is 16 hours behind NZST. Daylight Saving Time is observed from August to May when their clocks are turned forward by 1 hour. Peru is 17 hours behind NZST.

Currency

Argentina: Argentinean Peso (ARS)

Chile: Chilean Peso (CLP)

Peru: Peruvian Sol (PEN)

ATMs and money change facilities are available in cities. Major credit cards are widely accepted in tourist areas and major cities but cash is preferred in towns and rural areas. US Dollars and Euro are the preferred currency and can be used at money change facilities. It is recommended that small denomination notes are used and avoid larger bills as they are not often accepted.

Tipping & Bargaining

A 10% tip on services and at restaurants is appreciated but not obligatory. Hotel staff will expect a small tip for services. Bargaining is not generally practiced at markets or in shops. In Peru, good natured bargaining at markets is acceptable, however fierce haggling is not encouraged.

Language

Spanish is the official language of Argentina, Chile and Peru. Quechua is the second language of Peru. English is spoken in large tourist areas however it is not common in smaller towns and rural areas.

Electricity

Argentina: 220V 50Hz. An adapter is required.

Chile: 220V 50Hz. An adapter is required.

Peru: 220V 60Hz. An adapter is required.

Health

Argentina: When visiting Salta and Andean regions, there is minimal risk of altitude sickness. It is recommended to take a day or two to acclimatise before undertaking normal activity.

Chile: When visiting Antiplanic Lagoons and El Tatio in the Atacama Desert, there is minimal risk of altitude sickness. It is recommended to take a day or two to acclimatise before undertaking normal activity.

Peru: When visiting Machu Picchu, Cusco and Lake Titicaca, there is minimal risk of altitude sickness. It is recommended to take a day or two to acclimatise before undertaking normal activity. A yellow fever vaccination is strongly recommended if travelling to the Amazon.

Brazil: A yellow fever vaccination is strongly recommended.

Follow In the Footsteps of the Inca

From the famous city of Machu Picchu to the fortresses of Sacsayhuaman and Ollantaytambo, Peru is brimming with the ruins of former Inca cities. While the most impressive sites are scattered through the Sacred Valley, sites have also been unearthed and restored on Isla del Sol in Lake Titicaca and in the capital of Lima.

Peruvian cuisine is innovative and unique, reflecting immigrant and Indigenous influences, including ingredients favoured by the Inca. Chile and Argentina are both well known for their barbecued meats, served at restaurants called Parillas.



Party Like a Latino

True to its Spanish roots, the majority of South America's festivals and events are religious but the accompanying parades, costumes and days of celebration make for one huge party. Peru's biggest festival is Inti Raymi, however Independence Day, Carnival, Grape Festival and Day of the Dead are celebrated across the continent in accordance with local traditions.

You don't have to leave Buenos Aires to experience the gaucho (cowboy) culture. The Feria de Mataderos runs every Sunday and features horseback competitions, market stalls, folk dancers and of course, traditional Argentinean asado (barbecue).

Head to one of Mendoza's dozens of vineyards to experience the delights of Malbec, arguably one of Argentina's most popular exports. With over 75% of the country's vineyards found in this province, you don't have to look too far for a nice bottle to enjoy with a pre-packed picnic.

Explore Antarctica at its most pristine. Experience whales, penguins and seals as they court, feed and breed. Combine continental landings and visits to historic sites and take the opportunity to kayak amid pack ice.

Set sail aboard the *Greg Mortimer*, a 104 metre, purpose built expedition vessel and the first of its kind for Aurora Expeditions. Capable of negotiating strong winds and waves, it's built to world-class polar standards and features added creature comforts for a more enjoyable journey.

Day 1:

Arrive in Ushuaia and enjoy a day at leisure.

Day 2:

Morning at leisure to explore this bustling port city with its spectacular national parks and duty free shopping. Board the *Greg Mortimer* in the afternoon and get to know your fellow passengers.

Day 3:

Today, commence the Drake Passage crossing. Enjoy watching and photographing the many seabirds, including majestic albatrosses and giant petrels that follow in the ship's wake.

Day 4:

Begin spotting icebergs as the *Greg Mortimer* nears the South Shetland Islands and the tip of the Antarctic Peninsula. Weather permitting, there might be the first landing in Antarctica by late afternoon.

Days 5-9:

Over the next five days a host of choices are available and depending on ice and weather conditions, the western side of the Antarctic Peninsula is ready to explore. The experienced expedition team, who have made countless journeys to this area, will use their expertise to design the voyage from day to day in order to make best use of the prevailing weather, ice conditions and wildlife opportunities.

Being so far south, be prepared to experience approximately 18-20 hours of sunlight per day. Zodiac excursions will be typically two, occasionally three, times a day. They include cruising along spectacular ice cliffs, following whales feeding near the surface and landing on the continent and its off-shore islands to visit penguin rookeries, seal haul outs, historic huts and other favourite spots along the peninsula.

During this voyage, there will be an opportunity to camp ashore (weather and time permitting). Rest assured, the warm and comfortable ship with its hot showers will only be a short distance away.

Days 10-11:

The landings come to an end as the ship enters the Drake Passage for the return journey to South America. Approaching the tip of South America, the Captain may sail close to legendary Cape Horn, weather and time permitting.

Day 12:

Arrive back into Ushuaia and disembark around 8am.

Sail the legendary Beagle Channel, marvel at the snow-covered Andean peaks of rugged Patagonia. Zodiac cruise through fjords flanked by glaciers and watch as the captain skilfully navigates narrow channels while you keep watch for acrobatic dolphins, penguins, and seals. If lucky, we may see Humpbacks and Blue whales. Spend two days exploring and hiking at Torres del Paine National Park, a highlight for any visitor to Patagonia.

Day 1:

Arrive in Ushuaia and enjoy a free day at leisure.

Day 2:

Sail the legendary Beagle Channel enjoying the breathtaking scenery along Glacier Alley. Weather permitting, board Zodiacs for a closer look at the impressive Romanche Glacier.

Day 4:

In the wildlife-rich waters in and around Francisco Coloane Marine Park, enjoy Zodiac cruising amongst breathtaking scenery searching for marine birds, dolphins and possibly whales.

Day 5:

We may sail through Montañas Fjords and navigate Kirke Narrows to reach Puerto Natales.

Days 6-7:

Spend two days hiking and exploring in Torres del Paine National Park. Overnight in Torres del Paine.

Day 8:

Navigate White Narrows before reaching PIO XI glacier for a Zodiac cruise.

Day 9:

Discover Puerto Eden, a small isolated hamlet connected by wooden walkways. Navigate the English Narrows as we continue the voyage through Patagonia.

Days 10-11:

Over the next few days, enjoy the spectacular scenery while sailing through channels of northern Patagonia to reach the Moraleda Channel.

Search for wildlife around Melinka Island and perhaps enjoy a hike to study the birdlife and vegetation of the dense temperate woodlands.

Explore the coastline of Tic-Toc Bay, perhaps by Zodiac cruise. The waters in this whole area are renowned for a seasonal presence of blue whales and other species of cetaceans, marine mammals, and seabirds. Discover Castro, the capital of Chiloé province. Enjoy a delicious traditional curanto lunch where local potatoes, seafood, sausage are slow-cooked in the earth until tender.

Day 14:

Disembark in Puerto Montt, capital of The Lake District. Either extend your stay or continue your onward journey.

Day 1: Santiago Arrive into Santiago and transfer to the hotel.

Day 2: Santiago Enjoy a sightseeing tour of Santiago including the Central Market, La Moneda and the Fine Arts Museum. In the afternoon, take a tour of the Santa Rita winery. **(B)**

Day 3: Santiago to Torres del Paine Fly south to Punta Arenas (extra charge) and transfer to the hotel. Check into Rio Serrano Hotel. Stay the next three nights in Torres del Paine National Park. **(BLD)**

Day 4: Torres del Paine Enjoy a variety of activities offered by the hotel. These include hiking, lake tours, Grey Beach and the Cuernos Lookout. **(BLD)**

Day 5: Torres del Paine Enjoy activities offered by the hotel. **(BLD)**

Day 6: Torres del Paine to El Calafate Transfer to El Calafate in Argentinean Patagonia. Stay the next two nights in El Calafate. **(B)**

Day 7: El Calafate Drive to Bajo de Las Sombras port. After a safety briefing, embark on a mini trek across Perito Moreno Glacier. Later, return by boat and explore the walkways in front of the glacier. Be on the lookout for ice calving, which is an incredible sight and sound. **(B)**

Day 8: El Calafate to Buenos Aires Transfer to the airport for the flight to Buenos Aires (extra charge). Enjoy an afternoon at leisure exploring the city. In the evening enjoy dinner and a tango show. This dinner and show combines an exciting music and dance experience of Argentina's famous dance genre. Overnight in Buenos Aires. **(BD)**

Day 9: Buenos Aires to Puerto Iguazú Afternoon flight to Puerto Iguazú (extra charge) and transfer to the hotel. Stay the next two nights in Puerto Iguazú. **(B)**

Day 10: Puerto Iguazú Head towards the Argentine side of Iguazú National Park for a full day tour. The majority of the falls (approximately 80%) are on this side of the park. There are multiple walkways to ensure incredible views. Then, get ready to see the falls from the water and get wet. The truck and boat trip starts from the dock opposite San Martin Island and gives you a quick tour of the Lower Iguazú River Canyon. **(B)**

Day 11: Puerto Iguazú to Buenos Aires Today there is a half day tour of the Brazilian side of the falls before transferring to the airport for the flight back to Buenos Aires (extra charge). Stay the next two nights in Buenos Aires. **(B)**

Day 12: Buenos Aires Highlights of today's tour include the Plaza de Mayo, the Obelisk, Casa Rosada (Presidential Palace), Cabildo (Town Hall), and Congress Palace. Visit the Metropolitan Cathedral and see the Colon Opera House. Follow the steps of Evita Peron at Recoleta Cemetery before heading to San Telmo, Buenos Aires' most historic neighbourhood. Your sightseeing ends in La Boca, which today one of Buenos Aires' most authentic barrios. Enjoy a farewell dinner at Fervor. **(B)**



Day 1: Santiago

Arrive into Santiago and transfer to the hotel. Stay the next two nights in Santiago.

Day 2: Santiago

Join a full day tour, visiting three wineries in the Casablanca Valley. Explore the fermentation cellars and bottling plant to enrich your knowledge of the traditional production methods. Enjoy a delicious lunch paired with great wines. (BL)

Day 3: Santiago to Atacama

Fly to Calama airport (extra charge). Visit the Valley of the Moon – a spectacular geological wonder, created over many millennia as a result of the continually conflicting pressures of the Andes and the Cordillera de Domeyko. Later climb the Coyote Lookout. This clifftop vantage point is one of the most magnificent places to watch the sunset over the Valley. Transfer to the hotel. Stay the next two nights in Atacama. (B)

Day 4: Atacama

At 4am, head north to El Tatio, the biggest geothermal field in the world. Boiling water gurgles in the frozen ground emerging violently as steam in over 100 geysers, pools and fumaroles. Enjoy a light breakfast before taking a soak in one of the hot springs. End the day with a stop in Machuca. (B)

Day 5: Atacama to Siloli Desert

Transfer to the Hito Cajon, the border between Chile and Bolivia. Head towards the White and Green Lagoon at the foot of Licancabur Volcano. Continue to the Red Lagoon and into the Siloli Desert. Overnight in the Siloli Desert. (BLD)

Day 6: Siloli Desert to Colchani

Today enter the vast, white Salar de Uyuni to visit Incahuasi Island. It's a fantastic place for photography. After a picnic lunch on the island the trip continues towards Colchani. Overnight in Colchani. (BLD)

Day 7: Colchani to La Paz

It encompasses the mighty Iguazú Falls to the north and to the south, the breathtaking Perito Moreno Glacier which stands an impressive 35 kilometres long and three kilometres wide. In between lie the Andes Mountains, Patagonian lakes and the vast Atlantic coastline.

- 4.3 Facilities or services may change after the date of publication. We endeavour to keep travel agents informed of any changes to information in this brochure that are brought to our attention. - 6.4 Credit Card not permitted unless travel agent acts as merchant.

7. Amendment or Cancellation

- 7.1 If you wish, or circumstances require you to amend or cancel your booking for any reason, you should advise us in writing through your travel agent at the earliest possible time.
- 7.2 Where you cancel any booking more than thirty (30) days prior to your departure you are likely to have to pay a fee. A cancellation fee of \$200 will be imposed where cancellation is made within thirty (30) days prior to your departure, plus any suppliers charges as per note 7.3. Please refer however to Clause 7.6 for special conditions in some cases.
- 7.3 The above cancellation fees are required to offset booking, communication and administration charges that will have already been incurred by us. 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
